Club Membership

Where Did All That Money Go??

Thank you to all those club members who helped with our fundraising last year.

Fundraising - Our two main fundraisers this year - Pizza Promotions and Cadbury chocolate bars raised over \$1600 which was used to help pay for ice charges for our Club Champs, practice ice time for the National Champs, printing costs, and travel subsidies for NZISA selected skaters.

Grants - We received 3 main grants last year. The Christchurch City Council gave us a grant of \$1200 which was used to purchase Judges' Manuals, and pay for ice time. The Community Trust provided us with \$1210 which was used to pay for coaching fees at the South Island Champs, and also enabled us to get the jump harness up and running again. A Pub Charities grant of \$3850 was used pay the entry fees for all those skaters competing at Nationals.

Membership fees for last year totalled \$1940.00. This money was used for to cover some of our costs for the newsletter/ internet, NZISA affiliation fee, Sports Foundation membership and ice charges for competitions and tests.

ICE ON FIRE JANUARY REPORT

2003 is going to be a great year.

Centaurus will once again reign supreme, our skaters will wipe out the other clubs in South Islands and Nationals and each skater will improve and better all previous personal bests. Ice on Fire have new heights to aim for this year – by age, our team will now be competing at Junior level. This means longer and more challenging routines.

AUSTRALIAN NATIONALS (A skater's perspective)

Last year in early December three Centaurus skaters were chosen to represent New Zealand at the Australian Nationals. (Laura Mills, Elizabeth O'Neill & Caitlyn Paul). For Laura, this was her second year attending, but for both Elizabeth and Caitlyn, this was their first competition as New Zealand representatives.

All three skaters arrived in Brisbane very early Saturday morning thinking this would get them through customs quickly, only to find a line zig zagging almost out the doors. After a very long wait in queues and collecting our luggage we finally made our way outside to the nearest taxi which took us to our hotels. The weather was very different to NZ, averaging in the mid 30's every day. After settling into the hotel and doing as bit of shopping, we made our way via train to have a look at the rink.

The Brisbane rink "Ice World Boondall" was slightly larger than ours, with seating on both sides, and dressing rooms for skaters. It also had an upstairs viewing room which was mostly for judges and officials. Inside the rink foyer was a small shop selling some lovely skating dresses and tights. They also had a dark room with a huge TV screen showing various skaters' performances. All three girls had different opinions of the ice, but overall it seemed easier to jump on, otherwise very much like our own.

For Elizabeth and Caitlyn who were skating in the Intermediate grade, the competition was on Monday and Tuesday. Both skated well for their first Australian Nationals and were placed in the top third - Caitlyn (5th), and Elizabeth (6th).

On the Wednesday and Thursday Elizabeth and Caitlyn were able to relax and watch the skating in the Novice and Junior grades, but for Laura, this was her time to compete. She was skating in the Novice grade for the first time overseas and pulled off two good skates to finish in 9th position, in the top half of the competition.

A great result for all 3 skaters.

The Australian skaters were in general a lot faster on the ice and had stronger spins with many variations, especially in combination spins. There were also a lot of very elaborate costumes to be seen.

On the Friday, just after we had got used to the huge ants, cockroaches, and flies biting at us. it was time to return home. While checking in at the airport there was a slight drama. No names mentioned, but the same "responsible" skater who left a skating dress in a hotel wardrobe in Beijing, was found to have left her bag in the back of a taxi!! However after a few frantic phone calls the taxi was located and the bag safely recovered. Our flight was delayed when a passenger failed to turn up and we ended up waiting for ages while the airline staff rushed to find him.

But eventually we did arrive back in Christchurch in the early hours of Sunday morning for a well deserved 8 week break from skating.

Thank you to all the Centaurus Club members who supported us leading up to this competition, and to the NZISA for selecting us to be part of the team.
